These images are from an afternoon visit to Hakone Gardens in mid February 2021. The gardens provides a peaceful oasis set on the hillsides above a busy valley.

Construction began on the gardens and the Upper (Moon Viewing) House in 1917, inspired by Panama-Pacific Exposition in 1915 and a visit to Japan in 1916 by Oliver and Isabel Stine, the first owners. Like the world war that later interrupted the connection between Saratoga and Kyoto, the winter ends and the rains bring spring blooms to this corner of Santa Clara County. The estate and gardens are owned by the City of Saratoga and administered by The Hakone Foundation
